It's called gasoline in some places, and something else in others. The NFPA calls it a Class 1B liquid, while the DOT says it's a Class 3 hazardous material. So, what does this mean for your flammable waste management? Here are some answers to frequently asked questions: Is gasoline considered hazardous waste? Yes, when it's stale (more on that later). The EPA classifies it as hazardous waste because of its characteristics. What is a CLASS 1B liquid? It's a type of flammable liquid with a flashpoint lower than 73°F (22.8°C) and a boiling point at or above 100°F (37.8 °C). What is a Class 3 hazardous material? The DOT assigns hazmat classes, including Class 3 for flammable and combustible liquids like gasoline. How do you distinguish between a flammable liquid and a combustible one? Flammable liquids ignite more readily, while combustible ones require higher temperatures to catch fire. Both are classified as Class 3 hazardous materials. What is the flashpoint of gasoline? It's 45°F (-42.78°C), which means it can ignite quickly with an ignition source. The autoignition temperature is much higher, at 536°F (280°C). The boiling point is the temperature at which a liquid transforms into a gas, floating into the atmosphere. Water's boiling point is well-known, but did you know that gasoline has an initial boiling point of 95°F (35°C) at standard pressure? However, altitude and atmospheric pressure can affect boiling points and flashpoints, making them more volatile in certain locations. Flammable liquids like gasoline are regulated by federal agencies such as the DOT for transportation, OSHA for workplace safety, and the EPA for cradle-to-grave management.
