While Solitaire typically refers to classic Klondike Solitaire, there are many versions and difficulty levels such Klondike Solitaire Turn 3 and FreeCell. The game was first known, and is still called "Patience," reflecting the patience needed to win a game. On Solitaired, you can play unlimited online Solitaire games for free on your phone, desktop, or in full screen. Objective: Your goal is to arrange all cards into the 4 empty foundation piles, organized by suit in ascending order, starting with an Ace and progressing to a King. You achieve this by moving face-up cards from the stock pile and the tableau. Solitaire Setup Setting up Solitaire is simple. There are four basic piles that you use to play the game: The tableau: The main area of gameplay is the tableau, which is made up of 7 columns of 28 cards laid out from left to right. The first column consists of one card, and the subsequent columns have an additional card until the last column has 7. The last card in each column is face-up, while the rest remain face-down until revealed. The stockpile: The remaining 24 cards, placed face-down, become the stockpile, which you draw from 1 at a time when you run out of moves on the tableau. The waste pile (or talon): Any cards you flip from the stockpile move face-up into the waste pile. The face-up card that is revealed can be used to make plays. The foundation piles: These are the 4 piles you arrange your cards into. Each pile is organized by suit, and cards are placed in ascending order, starting with an Ace and ending with a King. Solitaire Rules Arrange cards by making moves according to these rules: Move face-up cards only. A face-down card in the tableau cannot be overturned and played until the face-up card on top of it is removed. If you play a face-up card from the waste pile, it will reveal another face-up card that can then be played on the foundation piles or tableau columns. Move a card from one tableau column to another if the card is the alternate color and one rank lower. For example, a 6 of Clubs can be placed on top of a 7 of Diamonds or Hearts. Move a group of sequenced cards. To do so, the highest-ranking card in the group must be placed on a card that is an alternate higher and one rank higher. Reveal face-down cards in tableau columns. Once a face-up card on top of a face-down card is moved, it will be turned face-up and available to play. Build foundation piles. Begin foundation piles with an Ace then add cards of the same suit to each pile in ascending order. In the Spades foundation, the next card after the Ace of Spades, for example, will be a 2 of Spades. Place Kings into empty columns. Only Kings or a group of sequenced cards with a King can be played in empty columns. Flip cards from the stock pile when you get stuck. If you cant make a move with the cards on the tableau, flip a card from the stock pile. Continue flipping until you can move a card to the tableau or foundation... Redeal the stockpile. Once all of the stock pile cards have been placed into the waste pile, you can click the waste pile so that the cards flip face-down back into the stockpile to be used again. Strategies to Win Solitaire Increase your chances of winning by using the following Solitaire strategies: Focus on revealing face-down cards. Surfacing as many cards as possible increases the options youll have for making moves and allows you to plan ahead. Turn over the first card from the stock pile before you make any moves. You should consider the first card in the stock pile as part of your option set to make your initial moves. For example, you may find that the first card from the stock pile can create a sequence, which can then help reveal another card. Check out the tableau before making a move. When you first start the game, quickly check out the tableau in conjunction with the card that is face-up in your waste pile and assess the moves you can make. Play Aces and 2s right away. Get your foundation piles started as soon as possible. If any Aces are playable, move them to your foundation piles. As soon as 2s are available, play those as well. Move cards from the larger tableau columns first. The larger tableau columns have more face-down cards you will need. Many of these cards may be important to sequence and solve the game. It's important to focus on revealing these cards first if possible, as the shorter tableau columns have fewer cards and therefore are easier to surface. Use face-up cards on the tableau first before moving them to the foundation piles. While it sounds counterintuitive, you may need these cards to make moves and reveal face-down cards. You never need an Ace or 2 in your tableau, but you might need more ranks to build on a sequence. So if you reveal a 4 of Diamonds that could go into the Diamond foundation pile, check to make sure it cant be used in a sequence or elsewhere that can help reveal another card. Use cards from the foundation piles, if necessary. For the same reasons described in the bullet above, you might need to replay foundation cards into the tableau to open more options for play. Clear tableau columns for kings. Whether you have a king showing or not, try to clear tableau columns so that you can fill them with Kings when a King becomes available. Use the hint or undo button. How Difficult is Solitaire? Classic or Klondike Solitaire is considered easy in difficulty. When looking at 2,898,974 random Solitaire Turn 1 games played, 955,805 (33.0%) were won. Turn 3, which has a win rate of 11.1%, is considered medium in difficulty. What is the difference between Turn 1 and Turn 3 Solitaire? In Turn 1, one card is turned over from the stock pile at a time. In Turn 3, 3 cards are turned over at a time, making it a harder game. Page 9I was playing a game of spider solitaire (my newest card game) and I received the following "null pointer exception error." This card game is built atop the engine of my other solitaire game, so I think I have the problem under control. The problem seemed to occur when I had clicked a new card button, pulling ten cards from the stack and placing them in the tableau (layout). This is normal for spider solitaire, because you are supposed to click this button at least 4-5 times throughout the game to ensure victory/making it, indeed, a crippling error to the engine of my card games. I am now investigating this problem, both to fix the bug in spider solitaire and provide a general improvement to my card games. More solitaire news will be coming up soon.\*\*FixedThis spider solitaire issue has been resolved. Ive fixed this card game and will be posting a new version of the game to cardgamesolitaire.com shortly. Have fun! Page 10I found another spider solitaire bug, which is similar to the bug I found previously in this card game. When pressing the new card button, AKA the stack, I get a null pointer exception, because the ten bottom-most cards in the tableau are not all present in the active cards array. This is especially baffling, because I thought the problem had been caused by another bug that I had just fixed in spider solitaire. Im currently in the process of debugging this little mystery, in the hopes of releasing this little fix soon. I hope to have an entirely bug-free version of spider solitaire out there for all you gamers to play. The plan is to trace the bottom-most card in the layout, so that it will be printed to the screen just before the error occurs next time. This should provide me with insight as to whats wrong. I think the major problem is that this version of solitaire, spider solitaire, uses a pointer-card to keep track of cards that arent necessarily stacked incrementally.\*\*FixedAs it turned out, when building down a stack of cards in the tableau of this card game, you had to not move a stack of more than 1 card. If the card was a cascade, placed atop another cards that the entire cascade was built-down to remove it from the gamean error would occur. This card game only allowed cascade removal of cards when you built down with only one card. I fixed this issue, making spider solitaire safe to play! Page 11I was playing spider solitaire, and I discovered another subtle issue. There was king in the tableau which had a queen (and various other cards) stacked atop it. Though all the cards stacked atop the king where white and active, the king remained gray and inactive. This may not be a fatal flaw in the card game, as it is just a nice feature I felt like adding to spider solitaire to make appearance in the card layout more legible. Even stranger, I continued to play solitaire to see where the card game would take me. I clicked on the stock, and drew a few more cards. Then, while playing around with cards in the tableau, I eventually dragged the card that appeared atop the king-4 card stack (shown below)and the king suddenly became active again!\*\*FixedThis card game solitaire problem has been fixed. Check back for more card game updates! Page 12I just updated the site to be wider, to accommodate for the full width of card game solitaire. Now you can play the card game with greater aesthetic pleasure, as it does not take up more than the width of the screen. More card games are coming soon. I just developed a spider solitaire game, which will go on either this site or another spider solitaire site. Several other versions of klondike, patience, and solitaire card games will be released very shortly on this site. Additionally, I updated the klondike solitaire game on the site to have a different card cover and different card artwork. This is in preparation for the next solitaire card game to be released (2-pass solitaire) which, in addition to artwork changes, will have sound, differing gameplay, and possibly an "undo" button. This function is used in the card game to determine whether or not the spot its dropping on is a card, background image, inactive cardetc. I think I can fix freecell by looking into this a little further: perhaps there is an invisible image lurking in the shadows of the card game. \*\*FixedAs it turns out, this minor issue was caused by my adding a new error message to the main screen of the card game. I fixed this problem by having freecell (and spider solitaire, to which I also added this feature) recognize the message as just an ordinary part of the background. The cards on the board are called the tableau. As you can see, there are seven stacks of cards, each with one more face-down card than the next. You may arrange cards in descending order on the tableau, switching between suits. For example, here, you'd be able to move the red queen on top of the black king, but you wouldnt be able to put the red 5 on top of the red 6. The face-down cards are revealed when there are no face-up cards in front of them. Revealing all the cards on the tableau is an important strategy of the game. When theres an empty spot, only a king can fill it, so keep that in mind! The spaces above are called foundations. The objective of the game is to arrange the cards from the tableau into the four suitsclubs, diamonds, spades, and heartsin ascending order starting with the ace. You must have the appropriate ace down before building on your foundations. Completing your foundations means youve won the solitaire game! The stack in the upper left is called the stock, which is a pile you can draw from to reveal new cards and add them to the tableau if youre able. The discard pile next to it is called the waste, where the unused stock cards are kept in order of draw. When the stock runs out, the waste is brought back into it in the same order. In this version of Solitaire, 1 Card Solitaire, you draw cards from the stock one at a time. Now, you can begin playing! As you can see, the game is all about arranging cards in order. And remember: once you finish your foundations, you win! The objective of 1 Card classic Solitaire is to fill your foundations in ascending order from Ace to King by suit. On the tableau, you must place cards in descending order from King to Ace, and they must alternate colors. Also, you can only begin a new stack on the tableau with a King, and the waste pile must maintain the same order that you drew them. With those rules understood, the best strategy to begin is to reveal as many face-down cards on the tableau as you can. Beginners will start going through the stock immediately, but these cards arent going anywhere. If you start filling up stacks on top of those face-down cards, its going to be harder to reveal them. If you can find some Aces this way, thats great! Once youve done what you can on the tableau, you can go through the stock. The stock is a good place to fish for specific cards since youll know exactly whats there. Plus, finding Aces in there means you can start building foundations from the tableau or from the stock as well! Remember that once you finish revealing the stock, the waste is placed back into the stock in the exact same order. Youll be repeating these processes for the rest of the game. As youre going, place any card in the foundations as you can. Otherwise, build your stacks to reveal more cards on the tableau. Once youve revealed all the cards on the tableau, its just a matter of time until youve won! After that, its about getting better, which is why we provide a timer to see your best time. Yes, there is a great deal of skill involved in the Solitaire card game. While the game itself does rely on luck and chance a lot, its what you do with the draw that matters.
