Unblocking pop ups on mac

Want to unblock or manage pop-up windows on your Mac? You just want to read the latest news or Mac advice without being bombarded with unexpected windows. However, some websites don't function properly without pop-up windows enabled. So, how do you unblock these windows in macOS? If you're using Apple's native browser, Safari, you need to navigate to "Preferences..." and then click on the "Websites" tab. From there, you can allow pop-ups. That's the quick answer, but let's dive deeper. I'm Andrew, a former Mac administrator, and I'll show you how to unblock pop-up windows when necessary. We'll look at the steps for each of the three main browsers, Safari, Chrome, and Firefox, and we'll also discuss how to unblock pop-ups for all sites as well as how to unblock per website. Let's start with a closer look at Safari. Fortunately, web browsers are getting better at detecting and blocking pop-up ads (pop up windows), and most browsers, including Apple's Safari, turn on the pop-up blocker by default. But if you need to unblock the pop-ups on Safari, here's how: First, open the Safari application to allow pop-up windows on all websites in Safari for Mac. Next, click on the Safari menu and choose Preferences... Click on the Websites tab and Pop-up Windows on the left menu under General. Next to When visiting other websites: click on the drop-down menu and choose Allow. This will allow pop-up windows on any websites except those you specify otherwise. You'll likely want to unblock pop-ups on a site-by-site basis, as needed. Here's how you can do that in Safari. Open the Safari app and navigate to the website on which you wish to unblock pop-ups. Head back to the Safari menu in the top left corner of the screen and choose Preferences... Click on the Websites tab and then select Pop-up Windows once again. With the site open in Safari, you should see the URL listed in the right pane under Currently Open Websites. Click on the dropdown next to the specific site and choose Allow. Close out of Preferences and refresh the web page. --- Allow pop-ups and here's how to do it in Firefox on Mac. First go to preferences then privacy & security then find the block pop-up windows option and select allow to unblock all pop ups. Alternatively click exceptions... for a blocked website, enter its URL and select allow to visit its pop up windows. To be safe unblock websites one by one after they prompt you of their request and allow them again if needed. **Allowing Pop-up Windows in Safari on Mac** If you need to allow pop-ups for certain websites, you can make the change in Safari Preferences. To do this, follow these steps: 1. Open Safari and browse to the website that includes the pop-ups you want to allow. 2. Click "Safari" in the menu bar and select "Preferences." 3. In the preferences window, click the "Websites" tab and then scroll down to the bottom of the sidebar. 4. Select "Pop-up Windows" and locate the name of the website you want to allow pop-ups on in the list. 5. Click the drop-down box beside the website name and select "Allow." Repeat this step for any other sites in the list that you want to allow pop-ups for. If you want to allow pop-ups on all websites by default, click the drop-down menu beside "When visiting other websites" and select "Allow." Click on it and select "Allow" or "Block and Notify" depending on your preference to automatically save this setting for individual websites in Safari. To change default settings for pop-ups on individual sites, open Safari and go to "Preferences". Select "Websites", then find the URL of the site you have open and a drop-down menu with two blue arrows. Choose "Allow" to allow pop-ups on this website. When visiting other websites aside from those specifically listed as Configured Websites, pop-ups will appear on any site except for the ones you've configured. However, if you'd rather not see them, you can select Block and Notify instead. This option will prevent the pop-up from appearing but still notify you that one was blocked, giving you the choice to view it anyway. To adjust this setting, follow these steps: Open Settings on your device, typically found on one of your Home Screen pages by default. If you can't locate it, navigate to the App Library and search for it using the top search bar. Once in the Settings app, scroll down to Safari, which is usually found in the same section as other default Apple apps like Messages, Phone, and FaceTime. From there, toggle off "Block Pop-ups" under the General setting heading. This will ensure that any pop-up you receive is displayed on your device. Alternatively, you can also configure Safari's pop-up blocker to allow or block pop-ups on a per-website basis by navigating to the Websites tab in Settings and selecting Pop-up Windows from the left sidebar. From there, choose either Allow, Block and Notify, or Block for each website as desired. **Allowing Pop-Ups in macOS: A Guide** To get a block notification, click Show pop-up blocker from the address bar. According to Apple, pop-ups can pose risks, especially if they're used by hackers to collect personal info. A general rule is to block all pop-ups by default; however, you can choose to Allow or Block and Notify for trusted sites that require pop-ups for essential features. While Safari's built-in pop-up blocker suffices for most users, third-party ad-blocker extensions can provide more advanced features. However, it's recommended to use a reputable blocker to avoid potential security risks. It's worth noting that not all pop-ups are created equal. Online support chats, banking verification windows, interactive games, and job applications rely on pop-ups in some way. When Safari blocks every pop-up, these websites may cease to function. To allow pop-ups on your Apple device, follow these steps: 1. Go to Safari > Preferences or use the key command ⌘. 2. Choose the pop-up settings for any currently open or previously edited websites. 3. Select the Allow option for sites you want to pop-ups to appear and Block and Notify for all others. 4. Pick one of the pop-up settings available: allow, block, or block and notify. By following these steps, you can enable pop-ups on your macOS device. Customizing website settings on your iOS device is surprisingly similar to tweaking settings on a Mac, but it's still worth noting that you'll probably need to manually reset the pop-up settings for each site after use to avoid being bombarded with ads or potentially dodgy pop-ups. You can easily access all of your open browser tabs and pop-ups using the Open Tabs button in Safari, which is represented by two overlapping squares in the bottom-right corner - this will help you navigate through your Safari windows with ease. To allow pop-ups on iOS and iPadOS: 1. Launch the Settings app 2. Scroll down to Safari 3. Toggle the Block Pop-ups switch If a particular site is still blocking pop-ups, try restarting your device and visiting the site again. If you continue to encounter issues, feel free to share an explanation in the comments below. Reader tips suggest that using Terminal can also help you disable Safari's pop-up blocker on Mac for good. Try entering the following command: defaults write com.apple.Safari com.apple.Safari.ContentPageGroupIdentifier.WebKit2JavaScriptCanOpenWindowsAutomatically -bool true to toggle it off, and re-enable it with defaults write com.apple.Safari com.apple.Safari.ContentPageGroupIdentifier.WebKit2JavaScriptCanOpenWindowsAutomatically -bool false if you need to switch back.
