To obtain a licence for tractors (with weight limitations) you must be at least 16 years old. The theory test may be taken 6 months before turning 21 at the earliest. Either way your licence application must be approved before you can take the theory test. When taking the test you must bring valid ID, and you will also be given a vision test. The theory test for tractors consists of 45 questions, at least 38 of which must be correct to pass (i.e. you are allowed a maximum of 7 incorrect answers). You have 60 minutes to complete the test.
