champion.Claressa Shields' net worth as of 2023It's safe to say that the self-proclaimed "G.W.O.A.T." has had a net worth valued at \$5 million as of 2023, with the majority of that money coming from her boxing purses.Following her three-fight exclusive deal with SkySports, it is estimated that she made \$1 million dollars for her fight against arch-nemesis Savannah Marshall, a figure that is likely to be repeated when she faces Cornejo on Saturday Outside of boxing, Shields also has signed a multi-fight deal with the PFL to see if she has a future in MMA. The amount of money she is being paid has not been released to the public but based on the recent deals that the PFL has announced, don't be surprised to hear that Shields has racked in sizeable checks for her two appearances in the promotion.Given her status as one of the most recognizable female boxers, it is no surprise to see the lists of sponsors that Shields has. She's been a brand ambassador for Nike, then Under Armour before finally settling on Puma. She's also sponsored by Monster Energy, Swimsuits For All, Audi, and Powerade to name a few of the big brands that support Shields throughout her legendary career.Claressa Shields vs. Maricela Cornejo takes place on Saturday, June 3, 2023, live from the Little Caesars Arena in Detroit, Michigan. Follow along with FanSided MMA for all your news and highlights. Claressa Shields (born March 17, 1995) grew up in Flint, Michigan. She discovered boxing at age 11. Consequently, she progressed quickly through amateur ranks. She won Olympic gold medals in 2012 and 2016, becoming the first American woman to win consecutive Olympic boxing golds. After turning professional in 2017, she conquered multiple weight divisions. She captured undisputed light middleweight titles in March 2021. Next, she secured undisputed middleweight status twice between 2019 and 2024. In July 2024, she added WBO light heavyweight and WBC heavyweight belts with a second-round TKO over Vanessa Lepage-Joanisse. Then on February 2, 2025, she beat Danielle Perkins by unanimous decision. That win crowned her the undisputed heavyweight champion across all four major belts. Significantly, she became the only boxer—man or woman—with undisputed titles in three weight divisions. Meanwhile, she paused her three-fight MMA career in May 2023 to focus fully on boxing. Shields holds an undefeated 16-0 pro boxing record with 3 knockouts. Her next title defense awaits on July 26, 2025, versus Lani Daniels in Detroit. Overall, Claressa remains boxing's "GWOAT". She inspires future female fighters by proving dominance, resilience, and trailblazing excellence. Claressa Shields turned 30 on March 17, 2025. Born in Flint, Michigan, she continues redefining boxing greatness. She remains the only fighter—man or woman—to hold undisputed titles in three divisions by age 30. Her early start and unmatched achievements cement her status as the GWOAT. Claressa Shields stands at 5 ft 8 in (173 cm) tall. She competes around 155 lb (70 kg) in middleweight boxing. Meanwhile, she can bulk up to 165 lb (75 kg) for light heavyweight or heavyweight bouts. Her 68-inch reach gives her striking range. Overall, her athletic height, weight, and reach offer a clear physical edge in the ring. Claressa Shields holds a 16-0 professional boxing record with 3 knockouts, yielding a 19% KO ratio. She has fought 133 rounds, averaging 8.3 rounds per bout. Meanwhile, she remains undefeated in MMA at 2-1, including one KO win . Overall, her stats highlight elite consistency, durability, and finishing ability. Moreover, she set the record for the fewest fights to win four-belt undisputed status, doing so in just nine bouts in April 2019. Additionally, she now claims undisputed titles in three divisions—light middleweight, middleweight, and heavyweight. These record-breaking stats, combined with her undefeated streak, reinforce her legacy as a dominant force in boxing. Claressa Shields dominated Danielle Perkins in Flint on February 2. She gained undisputed women's heavyweight champion status via a wide unanimous decision (100-89, 99-90, 97-92). Shields dropped Perkins twice—once in round three and again in the final seconds of round ten. She now holds WBC, IBF, WBO, and WBA heavyweight titles. Claressa Shields currently dates rapper Papoose, not married. Their relationship went public in late 2024. Previously, she was engaged to fitness trainer Tony Richardson, but that ended in 2023. Despite rumors, she never married Richardson. Overall, her personal life reflects resilience, privacy, and recent high-profile romance. Claressa has no biological daughter, but she previously temporarily cared for her cousin's baby, Klaressa, in 2014. Sadly, her cousin reclaimed custody after eight months. Nevertheless, Shields spoke publicly about that experience. She called it a powerful lesson in motherhood, emphasizing her compassion and readiness to nurture. "The Fire Inside" premiered December 25, 2024, dramatizing Claressa Shields' early boxing journey. It stars Ryan Destiny as Shields and Brian Tyree Henry as her coach. The film highlights Shields' Olympic triumph, resilience, and fight against adversity. Moreover, Shields served as executive producer, ensuring an authentic portrayal. She endorsed the film, calling it powerful and life-changing. Critics praised its emotional depth and social commentary on gender and athlete recognition. Overall, the biopic cements Shields' legacy as a trailblazer in women's boxing. Claressa's boxing journey began at age 11 when she trained under Jason Crutchfield at Flint's Berston Field House. Crutchfield, a four-time Golden Gloves champion, recognized Shields' potential early on. Despite not being a professional coach, he dedicated his time to mentoring her, often working as a utility worker during the day and coaching at night. Their partnership was pivotal in Shields' rise to prominence, culminating in her becoming the first American woman to win an Olympic gold medal in boxing at the 2012 London Olympics. Crutchfield's guidance was instrumental in shaping her into a world champion. However, in recent years, Shields transitioned to working with John David Jackson, a former world champion boxer turned trainer. Jackson has trained several notable fighters, including Sergey Kovalev and Bernard Hopkins. This change was due to logistical reasons, as Shields' training camps were no longer aligning with Crutchfield's location. Despite the coaching change, Crutchfield's foundational influence on Shields' career remains undeniable. His belief in her talent and dedication laid the groundwork for her historic achievements in the sport. As of 2025, Claressa Shields' net worth is estimated between \$5 million and \$9 million. Her wealth stems from boxing purses, MMA contracts, endorsements, and media ventures. Notably, she earned \$1.5 million for a fight in 2025 and secured over \$1 million for a 2022 bout against Savannah Marshall. Shields has endorsements with brands like Puma, Everlast, and Celsius. Her documentary, The Fire Inside, grossed \$8.1 million at the box office. Additionally, she has invested in real estate and launched a personal merchandise line. As a two-time Olympic gold medalist and the first boxer to hold undisputed titles in three weight classes, Shields continues to build her financial legacy both inside and outside the ring.
