How to look up criminal records in kentucky

Inquirers must ensure to sign the application, print their name, and describe the record to be inspected or duplicated. Copies of any record obtained in response to the subpoena must be furnished to other case parties for examination. What is included in a Criminal Record in Kentucky? Individuals that were arrested and charged can have their arrest records erased if they meet the following criteria: The charges were dismissed without prejudice (i.e., the charges cannot be refiled later) The person was charged with a crime but was not indicted by a grand jury within 6 months. In that case, the record might be automatically deleted after a specified period - typically 30 days after the individual is cleared of all charges. In that case, they will be alerted of any development concerning the inmate's custody status, including their release, transfer, parole, escape, etc. How to Expunge Arrest Records in Kentucky Expungement is a legal procedure that allows an arrest, charge, or conviction to be removed from a person's record. The requester can scroll through the names to locate the arrested person. The record is evidence that a person was suspected of engaging in criminal activity. In that case, the interested party has 60 days following the dismissal or acquittal to file a petition with the court. It is this subpoena type that is used to subpoena arrest records in Kentucky. If the individual is incarcerated in the state prison system, the Kentucky Department of Corrections (DOC) should be contacted. An arrest report is a legal document relating to an arrest maintained by a law enforcement agency. A requester can conduct a search by last name, first name, middle name, or/and inmate ID. County clerks maintain records of court proceedings and can provide access to criminal records upon request. The records are only a small part of a person's criminal history that contains information on related arrests made by state or local law enforcement officers. What is Contained in a Kentucky Arrest Record? This portal allows individuals to search for case information using various criteria, such as the defendant's name, case number, or attorney's name. About 45.8% (137,146) of the arrests in 2021 were Group A arrests, and 54.2% (162,363) were Group B arrests. Arrest records are public records in Kentucky. Alternatively, they can query the Department of Corrections directly by making open records requests. Of all the people arrested in Kentucky in 2021, 1,500 were juveniles, the remaining 298,009 were adults. After 30 days, these records will be automatically purged, and the subject is not compelled to take any action in this case. The search criteria are by inmate number, gender, last name, first name, middle name, and age range. It is advisable to contact the specific County Clerk's Office beforehand to inquire about their procedures and any associated fees. The only exception where access may be prohibited is when the record is not disclosable because of a law or court order. The report will typically include arrests, convictions, verdicts, incarceration information, and details on all arrest warrants issued against the record holder. For in-person requests for Kentucky criminal records, the inquirer must visit the Administrative Office of the Courts. It contains statements, evidence, charging details, and information on the nature of the arrest. For all cases dismissed with prejudice or acquitted on or after July 15, 2020, the Kentucky Judiciary instituted auto expungements. Hence, people may use third-party search engines to look for the records online, as such sites gather public data, including arrest records, from various government-owned databases. In Kentucky, an arrest record is kept by the law enforcement entity that made the arrest. According to Kentucky's Open Records Act, arrest records are public information. Also, suppose the inquirer is subscribed to the Victim Identification and Notification (VINE) system. Requesters must use the FastCheck interface for online access to Kentucky criminal records. Each request costs \$25, which can be paid by check, money order, or credit card. Arrest records are deemed public information in Kentucky and can be obtained by querying the agencies that maintain and disseminate the records. Alternatively, requesters can visit the law enforcement agency in the city or county where a person was arrested to retrieve arrest information. In Kentucky, a subpoena can be served in the same way as a summons. Typically, an individual seeking the expungement of a conviction, and associated arrest, must obtain a certificate of eligibility. To view a mugshot, the requester must enter the text that pops up on the screen. Nonetheless, arrest records are not the same as Kentucky criminal records. Alternatively, the interested person may search for arrest records using online databases that are available for free. However, according to KRS 61.878 (h), arrest records may be confidential in the following instances: When the investigation is ongoing If its release harms the agency by revealing the identity of unknown informants Arrest records involving crimes like domestic violence, stalking, sex crimes, crisis intervention, hate/bias crimes, involvement of juveniles Confidential arrest records will be open to the public after enforcement is complete or a decision is made regarding the crime committed by the arrest. A non-refundable \$25 fee is charged for each search. The Kentucky State Police charges ten cents for each page provided. Arrest reports are generally confidential, especially if the investigation of the crime committed is still ongoing. For example, The Louisville Metro Department of Corrections (LMDC) has an Inmate Search tool that can be used to find inmates who were recently arrested in Jefferson County. When an arrest record is automatically wiped, the expungement order is sent to the following entities: Defendant Defendant's legal representative Attorney for the county Kentucky State Police (KSP) The arresting agency that created the report Local correctional facility (if applicable) The petitioner must notify the court within 60 days of the expungement if intending to send the order to other agencies. This online database provides details such as the offender's name, mugshot, incarceration status, and the facility where they are held. The Kentucky DOC manages the state's correctional facilities and the inmates housed there. Kentucky arrest records stay on file indefinitely unless they are expunged. How to Search for a Kentucky Arrest Record Online Using a Third-Party Search Service Sometimes, obtaining copies of arrest records might be challenging. An arrest search can be conducted online or in person at the law enforcement agency in the city or county where the person was arrested. This service requires the submission of fingerprints and may have associated fees. However, if the charges were dismissed or the subject was acquitted, no certificate of eligibility or filing fee is required. The request must be in writing. This entity is usually a local police department or county sheriff's office. Nevertheless, calling the Kentucky State Police's Criminal Records Dissemination Section at (502) 227-8700 is advisable in most situations. The inquirer must also provide their full names, address, and phone number. Parties who want to obtain an arrest record in Kentucky must pay for the duplication of the record. Please enter your search data in any or all fields below. Being too broad about a request could cause the court to deem the subpoena oppressive or unreasonable and quash or modify it. Irrespective of which agency a record holder contacts, the party must provide specifics about the error, including documentary evidence where possible. However, arrest records might be reviewed for free on some government agency websites. Members of the public must usually cover the cost of reproducing an arrest record. Suppose the auto expungement is not granted for some reason or the prospective petitioner does not qualify for such relief. Criminal records can be retrieved online, in person, or via mail from the AOC. The requester must know the arrested person's name or inmate ID to be able to conduct a search. Please note that while these options provide access to criminal records in Kentucky, certain restrictions and guidelines may apply to the dissemination of sensitive information. The state's Open Records Act mandates that agencies responsible for disseminating arrest records must charge a nominal fee to cover the reproduction costs. Depending on the circumstances surrounding the arrest, an arrest record may also include some information listed in a person's criminal history. Most third-party services only require basic information (the last name, city, state) to find records for the requesting party. The Kentucky State Police is tasked with reporting the expungement to federal agencies. Similarly, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Division of Community Corrections provides an online search tool where individuals can find recent arrests in Fayette County.
